- For the first half of the day we will head into the downtown Atlanta area via the MARTA train to participate in The Plunge. We will engage those in need of prayer and seek out opportunity to share Gospel witness.
- We will return early afternoon to Vertical Life Church to prepare for dinner and spend the remainder of our evening with VLC Students in their worship gathering.

MINISTRY PARTNERS

On any mission trip, our aim is to share the gospel of Jesus Christ and work to meet practical needs of the community in which we are serving. Through opportunities provided by Vertical Life and our own experience serving in the Atlanta area, we will be arriving with the tools necessary to be sharing the gospel. Both Paulding County and the City of Atlanta have a very real and observable struggle with hunger. For this reason, we have made time to serve at 2 faith-based food pantry's, one within the city itself and another right in the heart of Paulding County. Below, you will find a little bit of information about each of these partners.



A division of the Atlanta Community Food Bank, Grace Community Food Pantry's mission is to involve, educate, and unite people in the work of ending hunger in the Atlanta area.

Pantry volunteers will aid in sorting food items and stocking the shelves of the Food Pantry. Volunteers will organize and unpack the food items that have been delivered, ensure freshness, and monitor quality before supplying the appropriate shelves with designated items. Volunteers will also break down boxes and take cardboard to the recycling bin/trash. Other duties as necessary.



A Non-Profit Organization founded in 1987 by five local churches (Dallas 1st Baptist, Dallas 1st UMC, New Canaan Baptist, New Hope Baptist, and Poplar Springs Baptist) who formed a partnership to battle the effects of poverty and hunger... from these humble beginnings we have grown into a multi-faceted agency assisting our neighbors of low-income with their basic needs... Helping Hands of Paulding County GA is a vital coalition of churches, businesses, civic groups, and caring individuals representing community partnership at its very best.

HOW TO PRAY FOR YOUR STUDENTS

We ask that you spend some time each day this week praying for your student. If you are looking for specific ways to pray, please take some time to review the daily breakdown below.

Sunday: Understanding

As we transition into a new ministry context, many of our students will need to set aside preconceived notions about ministry. We will meet our church hosts this evening and we ask that you pray for our students to be gracious guests.

Monday: Faithfulness

The first day of service can be a bit of a shock. Students will realize that their fall break won't be so much of a break. Pray that they would stay faithful to their mission to serve.

Tuesday: Steadfastness

We will waste no time jumping into service. This will be a long day of ministry and we ask that you pray for our students to thrive in a full day of service.

Wednesday: Resolve

This day will involve the most gospel conversations. Students will receive training and supervision but breaking the ice with someone far from the Lord can be unnerving. Pray that our students wouldn't allow anything stand between Jesus and the people we seek to serve.

Thursday: Safety

Thursday is a fun day and a travel day. Pray for safety as we travel home and pray that we will have a wealth of stories of God's grace to share.

PACKING LIST

BRING THESE

- Air Mattress or cot
- Twin sheets and/or sleeping bag and pillow
- Rain Jacket
- Bath towel
- Refillable water bottle
- Closed toe, closed heel shoes
- Bible, notepad, and pen
- Toiletries (toothbrush, toothpaste, shampoo, deodorant, etc.)
- Sun/bug protection
- Spending money for snacks and souvenirs.

DON'T BRING THESE

- Alcohol, tobacco or illegal drugs
- Fireworks
- Any kind of weapon
- Anything that resembles a weapon
- Pornography of any kind
- Anything that could be used for pranks (water balloons, silly string, etc)
- Energy drinks

ABOUT PROHIBITED ITEMS

The above list is intended to be but may not be exhaustive. Students and parents should use common sense when deciding whether or not an item is appropriate to pack. In order to ensure the safety and spirit of this trip, students found to be in possession of any of the above items will have the item confiscated, their parent will be notified, and the student's immediate dismissal will be required.

Parents are responsible for arranging transportation for students dismissed from trips.

Spirit of this policy

Access to cell phones and social media can enhance some portions of the trip experience. Access also gives parents the opportunity to contact their student directly. However, cell phones have also proven themselves to be a notorious distraction and there is no essential element of camp that can not be experienced without a phone. It is our intent to allow students and parents the highest degree of autonomy possible while preserving the safety, integrity and experience of all students in attendance.

Should I send my student with a phone?

As a parent, you are the first line of defense and sound decision making for your student. As stated above, there is no essential element of trip that cannot be experienced without a phone. Please only send a phone with your student if you can confidently agree to each of the statements below.

- My student consistently shows sound judgement in the use of his/her phone.
- My student does not use his/her phone at inappropriate times or in inappropriate ways.
- I have had a conversation with my student about responsible phone use on church trips.

Students who misuse their phones

Trip leaders reserve the right to confiscate a student's cell phone. Parents of students who have their cell phone confiscated will be notified immediately. A student will have their phone confiscated and returned only when the group arrives back at The Glade church if the student is found to have used the phone in any of the following ways:

- Accessing any inappropriate content
- Harassing another student or leader through the use of technology
- Using the phone at inappropriate times or inappropriate ways

Illegal Possession

Should any Next Generation leader witness or have knowledge of a student at a church sponsored activity who is in possession of any of these items, the leader will notify the trip leader and, if warranted, the appropriate authorities.

- Alcohol, illegal drugs, pornography, or tobacco products
- Firearms, knives, martial arts items, or any other weapons.

Inappropriate Behaviors

The following lists behaviors and activities which are prohibited by students at any church sponsored event.

- Assault
- Physical displays of affection (beyond handholding and light hugs)
- Leaving an event/activity without consent from a ministry leader
- Leaving church property without consent from a parent or ministry leader
- Vandalism or willful damage to property
- Breaking curfew on an overnight church activity
- Stealing
- Body piercing or permanent tattooing while on a church sponsored outing
- Wearing inappropriate or revealing clothing

Actions

The following outlines how we will manage infractions of the guidelines listed above.

- Trip leader and a group of chaperones will discuss the infraction
- Student will have an opportunity to explain the situation
- Trip leader and chaperones will make a decision based on the severity of the infraction to:
 - Call parents of student
 - Remove student from event / trip / outing
 - Suspension from future ministry events
 - Notification of proper authorities
